
MUSIC MEMORIALS IN VIENNA

Werner Hackl



Vienna, the world capital of music, is rich in a wide variety of memorials from the world of music. This work tries to give the interested reader an up-to-date picture of important music memorials in Vienna. Street names are used to describe the memory of a city because they keep the memory of certain people alive. Not only musicians were included in this collection, but also people who were important for the development of musical life in Vienna. The life dates of those honored in this way extend over half a millennium from 1500 to 2020. Of the innumerable artists in Vienna, the majority are male, which corresponds to the society of earlier centuries, but the proportion of women is also considerable. The range of topics is broad, which is why it remains an attempt to offer a complete music topography of Vienna, even if, despite a lot of research, it will remain a selection of subjective traits. In order to achieve as balanced a picture as possible of the memorial sites recorded, certain criteria were taken into account with regard to the selection. Regarding the fact that all memorials refer to famous personalities from the past, Helmut Qualtinger says: "In Vienna you have to die first before you can be celebrated, but then you live long."

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Albrechtsberger Johann Georg, 1736 Klosterneuburg – 1809 Vienna. Court organist, cathedral music director.

First at the Stiftsgymnasium Melk and in 1753 at the Jesuit seminary in Vienna (here a classmate of Michael Haydn), 1755 organist in Raab (Györ, Hungary), 1757-1759 in Maria Taferl, 1760 in Melk. In 1768 Albrechtsberger came to Vienna. In 1771 he became the Regens Chori at the Carmelite Church, and in 1772 he became the second court organist. His acquaintances and friendships with important musicians (including J. Haydn, W. A. Mozart, D. v. Dittersdorf) and the publication of theoretical works made him one of the leading figures in Viennese musical life. In 1794 Haydn sent his student Ludwig van Beethoven to Albrechtsberger, who taught him theory and counterpoint for a year. After Mozart's death, Albrechtsberger became the first court organist, and in 1792 the cathedral music director at St. Stephan. Albrechtsberger was buried at the St. Marxer Friedhof.

Bartók Béla, 1881Nagyszentmiklós – 1945 New York. Composer.

From 1893 he received music and composition lessons in Pressburg and from 1899 studied piano and composition in Budapest. In the years 1905/1906 Bartók stayed in Vienna, where the early work "Two Orchestral Suites" op.3 and 4 was written. From 1908 to 1934 he was professor of piano at the Franz Liszt Music Academy in Budapest. In 1940 Bartók emigrated to the USA before fascism, where he died of leukemia in New York in 1945 after a long illness. Initially buried in New York, his body was transferred in 1988 and buried in the Farkasréti Cemetery in Budapest as part of a state funeral.

Founded here in 1788 the personal chef of Empress Maria Theresa, Franz Jahn a noble restaurant, a so-called traiteurie, where famous concerts were held. Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart performed here in 1788 a pastoral by Handel, and Ludwig van Beethoven started a quintet for four wind instruments and pianoforte in 1797.


Memorial plaque: 1, Neuer Markt 2

Lehár Franz, 1870 Komorn – 1948 Bad Ischl. Composer.

Franz Lehár initially lived at Mariahilfer Strasse 5, then in his own house at Theobaldgasse 16, where he was registered from 1919 to 1931. In 1932 he bought the house at 19, Hackhofergasse (Schikanederschlössel)



Schönberg Arnold, 1874 Vienna – 1951 Los Angeles-. Composer.

As a music theorist, he had a great influence on the music of the 20th century. The radical developments in composition technique and its theoretical foundations were initiated by him. Arnold Schönberg, Alban Berg, Anton Webern and other students and interpreters formed a circle of like-minded people called the Second Viennese School.








RICHARD WAGNER
